R.E.G. Recording Artist E. L. Williams New Single Release "I Magnify Thy Name"


Philadelphia Produces Another Native Son With That Magical Musical Touch

Williams joined R.E.G. in the latter part of 2018 based upon his previous business relationship with Owner




and Founder Leroy Roebuck and his newly established yet radiant business relationship with Dee Wellmon, R.E.G. Co-Founder/President.

A Little Piece of History... Remember When!



Doug "Jocko" Henderson

"Hello, Daddy-O and Mommy-O. This is Jocko" was one of **Doug "Jocko" Henderson's** signature phrases on the radio when he worked for WDAS in Philadelphia back in the 1950s-70s. He was known for his rhyming wordplay (including another phrase "**Oo-poppa-doo**, how do you do." It is this, along with his 1979 single "Rhythm Talk," that has earned Henderson the nickname "The Original Rapper." He was also known as the "Ace from Outer Space," which tied in with his program, "The Rocket Ship Show."

In addition to his daily early evening show in Philly, Henderson also had a morning program in New York with **WLIB**. Henderson was more than a disc jockey, he sought to change his community. He ran unsuccessfully for United States Congress in 1978 but he did not let that stop him. He established the "**Get Ready"** program which tried to help students learn through rap lyrics. He also founded the magazine "Philly Talk" in the 1970s, which promoted local culture.



"The Guy with the Goods"

Georgie Woods is remembered as the African American radio broadcaster who came from New York to Philadelphia in 1953 ready to make his mark. He made a difference in Philadelphia and at the following radio stations- WDAS and WHAT. He was a consultant to Dick Clark in regards to advising him on which records were more popular in the African American community.

In the 1960's, **Georgie Woods** used the airwaves to discuss the issues of Civil Rights and to equally support the I Have A Dream movement of Dr. Marint Luther King, Jr. He was the first radio broadcaster to use the term "blue-eyed soul", to describe soul music sung by White artists, rather than Black artists.

Georgie Woods also became a major promoter of live shows for major Black acts at The Uptown Theatre in North Philadelphia.
